

Delegate Motion Guide

Presenting and Processing a Motion

- 1. Delegate rises to a microphone and waits to be recognized by the Speaker.
- 2. Delegate states his/her name, chapter and position (1st or 2nd delegate) and makes a motion (see below).
- 3. Speaker repeats the motion and calls for discussion. Amendments may be made at this time.
- 4. After discussion is complete, the Speaker calls for a vote on the motion.
- 5. Speaker announces the result of the vote.

Amendments to Resolutions and Motions

• Any delegate may modify the wording of a resolution or motion. Please refer to the Short Amendment Form.

	Ask a question about parliamentary procedure	"I have a parliamentary inquiry"	No	No	None

	Stop debating and take a vote immediately	"I move to end debate and vote"	No	No	2/3
	Stop debating after a set time	"I move to limit debate to (insert time frame)"	Restricted debate	Restricted	2/3
	Make a change to the main motion	"I move to amend by"	Yes	Yes	Majority
	Refer a resolution for further consideration	"I move to refer the motion to the committee"	Restricted debate	Restricted	Majority
	Pull a motion that you made from the floor	"I move to withdraw the previous motion"	No	No	None
